5. **Denied Entry at Airport**

First-time traveler was denied entry at port of entry. CBP suspected false intentions and issued expedited removal. 5-year bar.

6. False Info on Visa Form

Years later, a tourist's visa was revoked when officers discovered incorrect employment history on an old application.

7. Social Media Problem

An Instagram post suggested a visitor was looking for U.S. job offers. This led to inspection and visa cancellation.

8. Family Visa History Caused Denials

A family member's past overstay created suspicion for the whole family. Multiple visa refusals followed.

9. Consulate Cancelled Visa Without Notice

A client's visa was still in his passport but was revoked in the U.S. system (CLASS). Denied boarding by airline.
